Band: Crazy Cavan / The Rat Pack Venue: Minerva, Southend-on-Sea

Date: 24/03/07

Hi there my name's Terry, better known as Lofty to those that know me;anyway Spike has asked me to do a review on the Minerva gig.

Southend was a hub for the Rock n Roll scene in the 70's with places like The Pier bar (Long bar), Kursaal, Queens Hotel, Baz's café and of course The Minerva.l can remember the first Rock n Roll gig I went to was way back in 1972 at The Kursaal appearing was Heinz,Shakin' Stevens and The Sunsets,Screaming Lord Sutch and a very young Dr Feelgood all dressed in drapes.



This nostalgic event put on by Spike and Linette had many of us travelling down memory lane for the night as The Minerva was a lively Rock n Roll pub in the mid 70's. I myself have not set foot in the place since that era and found a few changes to the place. Mainly the stage which was on the left as you walked in is now at the back. The outside apart from a few licks of paint looks pretty much the same.

A few of us met in the car pack opposite and went in shortly after 7pm,not being the first to arrive it did not take long for the place to fill up .There

was a lot of old faces and strange faces as people had travelled far and wide to be there. Portsmouth, London, Clacton to name but a few places that I know friends had come from.

CJ the DJ a friend from the Haverlock/Old Maypole days kicked off the evening with some choice music which soon had the strollers, jivers and boppers filling the dance floor. This had the mood set for The Ratpack's first set around 9pm. I sure a lot of you are familiar with this group as there has been a few reviews on them in previous Mad Rat mags. For those of you who aren't this local group are very lively and are always up for a party performance. I follow The Ratpack as much as I can and in fact they played for me at my 50th party last year.

A good mixture of Rockabilly /Rock n Roll was played by them in this first set and everybody was certainly warmed up (if they wasn't already) by the end of the set.

The next DJ needs no introduction 'Wildcat Pete' as I'm sure many of you can remember him from the 70's and beyond. Pete dug out some classics including the famous bopper 'Jungle Rock' and at the end of his session Spike got him up on stage to present him with a 60th birthday cake complete with candles for him to blow out.

Now the moment had arrived which we had all been waiting for it was now around 11.30pm and Crazy Cavan and the Rhythm Rockers were about to perform. A crowd had massed by the front of the stage full of anticipation as Spike announced them Then as they started singing classics like 'Are you still crazy' 'My Little Teddy Girl' 'Teddy boy boogie'

etc the crowd joined in doing the Cavan Rock and going wild just like the old days.

It was good to see Graham Price back on bass again replacing Steve (Vance) Vincent and Brian (or Bunna as he likes to be called) Standing in for Mike Coffey who has gone back to Canada.

Throughout the performance various people joined them on stage including Little Brian some of you may remember him as a DJ from the Adam & Eve/Pembury Tavern.He done the backing vocals to Knock Knock from the album 'Rockabilty' which was recorded on his uncles farm.Also my wife Sandra encouraged by our friend Lou jumped up there for a few numbers.The first encore was the Teddyboy anthem 'Old Black Joe' and the performance was rounded off with 'Rockabilly Rools! My all time favourite.

We were now into the early hours of the morning with the clocks going forward shortly but this did not deter everyone.CJ the DJ started spinning the wax again whilst The Ratpack got ready for their second set.A formidable task you would have thought after an explosive performance by Cavan by these boys are professional and soon had the dance floor filled again throughout the set.They are a very versatile band with both guitarist Spike and Drummer Steve having a go on vocals.

CJ the DJ rounded off the night (or what now was morning) with a final stint before we all staggered out at what was now 5am

This event will be remembered for a very long time and hopefully won't be the last in Southend!

Are you still Crazy are you still wild? We are!

DISC JOCKEY JAMBOREE

NOW...

We are lucky enough on today's rock 'n' roll/rockabilly/jive scene to have some excellent D.J.'s that not only play some great records (both rare and classic) but also put on a bit of a show too. I am not talking about all-talking and all-juggling cats and kittens that want to be the centre of everyone's attention, but the type of D.J. that actually thinks about his set beforehand.

I am going to ramble on about one such wax spinner, At Koning. I was bar-hopping and browsing the vintage stalls with my wife Fi at

excellent mixture of rockabilly, 'rock 'n' roll', western swing and jive. In fact, I believe he was the perfect D.J. for the riot, as he catered for everyone's tastes. It was not just his choice of tunes, we stayed awhile and were glad we did, the energy he put into his gig was amazing, and this guy obviously loves what he is doing, his arms were waving, and his fingers were popping, he even jumped off of the stage to have a jive or two and made it back in time for the next platter. If you are at a weekender somewhere on this rockin' planet and you see this guy's name on the D.J. list, check him out, you will be glad you did.lf my memory serves me correctly, it was also at the riot that I came across another cool pair of D.J.'s. On that particular occasion it was Jerry Chatabox and Robin's 'Bakelite Boogie' dishing up the sounds in a kind of duelling D.J. type format. One played a record and the other had then to match it, it appeared off the cuff and was a very enjoyable listen. As I have said, we have a fine selection of latter day wax spinners, but it is all too easy to forget the pioneers, those D.J.'s whose innovative styles paved the way for us to be able to go to an event like the riot and have such a good time now.

THEN

I would have loved to have lived in Memphis, Tennessee circa 1954 (as you may already have detected from previous ramblings!), I can imagine myself tuning into Dewey Phillips 'Red Hot & Blue' radio show. In the segregated south in the fifties Dewey plays the records he liked, whether they were rhythm 'n' blues, country, or bluegrass (rockabilly was just starting to make noises around this time). He did not care what race a singer was, if he thought the sound was hot he would play it. On air, he acted like a madman, hitting microphones, yelling and singing along to the tunes as they played.

If you moved the dial on the radio just a touch you could have tuned into WHHM and listen to Sleepy Eyed John's 'Hillbilly Hit Parade'. Sleepy Eyed John, the radio moniker of John Lepley, was a champion of country music. While Dewey Phillips heavily promoted Elvis's 'That's All Right Mama' John played the flipside of the Sun 209 single 'Blue Moon of Kentucky'. If I had been a D.J. back then, I would have chosen 'Blue Moon' it has more of a zip to it. WHHM broadcasts from West Memphis in Arkansas, just across the Memphis Bridge from downtown Memphis, Tennessee. He was not a fan of Sam Phillips or the releases that came out of the Sun recording studio. On air. he was always making disparaging remarks about the Sun recordings, musicians and singers. Vernon Presley had to be physically stopped from going to his radio station after one such comment, about Elvis's singing, left him fumina.


He did and said what he liked on air, often playing a record and ripping it from the turntable halfway through and tossing it into the rubbish bin and then playing something he considered to be more tuneful. John may not have liked what he heard in Elvis, but he knew a good thing when he saw one, and booked him for an appearance at the 'Eagles Nest', a night club that he promoted. In doing so, he

became one of the very fist promoters to book Elvis Presley. It was situated in Memphis, on the intersection of Lamar Avenue and Winchester Avenue, above a swimming pool called the 'Clearpool Entertainment Complex'. John also fronted a western swing band that had a residency at the 'Eagles Nest', they may have been the 'Starlight Wranglers', but unfortunately information about John is hard to come by, and he seems destined to fade into musical obscurity.

In an article written by Reggie Young, (Eddie Bond's guitarist in 'The Stompers' from 1955 to 1958) it is mentioned that local disc jockey, 'Sleepy Eved' John Lepley heard 'The Stompers' play (this was probably at 'The Eagles Nest') and invited them to record the song 'Rocking Daddy' at WHHM studio, although in an interview with Eddie in September/August 1974 edition of 'Rockville International' he says that the tune was recorded at 'WMPS' studios in Memphis. Wherever the case, 'Mercury Records' heard

the song and then promptly signed them to a record deal. Lepley also loved to promote himself as much as possible. Elvis played on the back of a flatbed truck at The Lamar-Airways Shopping Centre on September 9th.1954 with Scotty and Bill but they were introduced as 'Sleepy Eyed John's Eagles Nest Band'. Considering how influential John was in the Memphis area and his love of self-promotion, it is surprising that I have not come across any pictures of him as yet. Johnny Cash mentions him in his autobiography 'CASH', and apparently he had the looks for stardom as well as the drive. To this day, however, he remains something of an enigma, an urban myth in the history of rock 'n' roll D.J.'s. Thanks to Don Jones for all his help in putting this 'Sleepy Eyed John' segment together. LIGHTEN UP OR LOSE BANDS

Being in a rock n Roll band in these days of garage, grunge, electro hip hop, rap, house and various other styles of what passes for music in the modern world, is not the way to get famous. Or rich or indeed attract any recognition at all.

In fact, if you want to be criticised for your style, instrumentation, the fact that you don't play cover versions note for note as they were on the originals, then being in a rock n roll band is the place to be! Especially in the UK.

The UK audiences have a reputation for being blinkered and narrow minded to the point of being almost impossible to please! For instance, recall Big Sandy & The Flyrights who's last appearance in the UK was widely criticised for their set, which was a mixture of the eclectic, laid back, fifties lounge lizard cum crooning style, which has adorned their last few albums. They haven't played out and out rockabilly for nearly 10 years....what did people expect?

Many other bands too, have found that the UK rock n roll scene with it's unforgiving patrons is a particularly hard one to overcome, so much so that they no longer regard the scene as their primary source of income! Kav & the Kavmen for instance have stopped doing the UK rock n roll scene altogether, concentrating more on corporate function work, where people appreciate the music they are playing for what it is. Other bands have found that cruise ship work and playing the scene in Europe is far more rewarding in terms of audience feedback, especially in Holland and Germany were crowds are wildly enthusiastic and simply having 'a damn good time' is the order of the day! So....should we expect bands to be totally faithful to the originals or not? My particular feeling is that if people want to listen to the original tunes, as they were played, then ditch the band and play records or CD's all night!

If a band is to cover songs, and a lot do, then there are two schools of thought as to how it should be done.

Stay faithful to the original spirit of the recording but without playing the song note for note or perform the song in a totally different way....slow it down, use different instrumenta

tion, change the emphasis of the lyrics. It can work....a good example is Rockin' Rocket 88's version of "Please Don't Touch", where the distinctive and well known guitar intro and repeated riff is replaced with an electric violin! Radical when you think about it, but it works like a dream!

Don't forget that many of the original recordings were speeded up, slowed down or messed about with at the production stage, which made them sound totally different to the way that they were originally performed! So if you are a band that is considering covering a song, don't be afraid to perform YOUR interpretation of it.

As for audiences, well, I think that perhaps we all need to lighten up a bit and be a bit more forgiving, after all, if we keep criticising hard working bands they'll soon get fed up and go to where they receive more appreciation for what they are doing, even if that does mean wedding receptions and birthday parties!!

anyone witha chance to see them would be a raving loon if they passed up this chance. The second album we review (Big Money) is more dedicated to the scene and is less commercial in its choice of tracks than the other but is still a must have for any collector containing three originals Crazy Nights the second original, one for the swingers i think this is great it shows off the versatlity of the trio perfectly, She's The Guilty One a nice steady bopper, my least favourite im afraid but still a good track and Borderline Boogie the first of the originals on the album this rocks big time, , the other eleven are covers with twist read on to find out why. Play My Boogie just as good as the original with that pounding piano some great vocals and a big beating bass break a great start to this album, Your True Love great dance stuff harmonies and a very authentic feel, Love Me again this is an excellent cover lots of voices and a steady beat some nice fills and a big dance beat, Big Money one for the strollers could have been recorded in the fifties great sound, Crazy Arms bum clutching time a terrific country ballad outstanding, Rock Island Line a very laid back arangement to this one this is too cool and when it kicks it really kicks, All Shook Up an interesting arrangment of this old cherry but its ripe for the pickin' another excellent track, Paranoia brilliant nothing else to say, ,Pucker paint back to the dancers a great track and very well performed , All Over A Kiss another nice jiver with a bluesy feel, Deep Elm Blues a trip to hillbilly country with this more verstility and a great

original style. A front porch track! The whole album like the last we reviewed is incredible these guys are good! Very Good! a very authentic sound to this album each track well thought out and a must for the record collector. All this album is missing is the scratches. Somebody send me this bands gig list.

THE TOP CATS Q 'N' A

Now, here is a band guaranteed to give you what you want, their not so average set can combine anything from Maniac to Veronica all done in a Top Cat way that combines the authentic with the modern great vocals harmonies and all this from a trio that has been gigging for nearly twenty years but until now have been seemingly the norths best kept secret. Their latest CD which we will review next month is an incredible mix of good rockin'

and you will see from this interview with Steve, Topcats standup drummer why they have a firm and loyal forever growing fanbase.

Right Steve I know that you have played a few clubs in the south and I know that you have been gigging for many years as the topcats, many of your fans saw you first two years ago at the rockers reunion. What made you decide it was time to break out and head south?



We have played South quite a bit over the years BUT since doing the Rockers nour followers keep

asking us when are you back down south, so it's good for us when we do, hopefully we will be back down soon.

It appears that once you're a topcats fan your hooked for life how easy is it to manage a social relationship with fans that may have an opinion on your latest album. Do you ever fall out with people because they think your last album was better than the new one etc.?

Our fans mean a lot to us without them there wouldn't be Topcats, we try and keeping contact with as many as we can through text, email or phone, and our fans suggest songs to us that we could convert and "Topcat", so in someways they have an input as well which we think is good.

You incorporate a lot of tracks in your set that are not from the fifties but are played in a rockabilly way is this a deliberate attempt to give everyone in your audience something they know?

Even though it may offend the rockin' crowd. What we try to do as The Topcats is do songs that people know, turn them into rockabilly which gives us a wider audience to play to, on top of our fifties stuff so everybody gets a fair share, as we do a lot of private functions weddings, parties you have to mix and match to suit all of your audience.

Your've been zooming off around the world for the last two years your popularity abroad has really grown, why do you think this has happened and why now? And where have you been?

We thought it was about time we branched out further and take the Topcat sound to as many countries as possible so far we have toured Bulgaria and Spain and we are off to Finland in April for 4 gigs with two Finnish bands and then at the end of April Belgium and Holland.

Due to this sudden popularity in Europe and beyond your CD's need to be available worldwide, how do you go about getting distribution in foreign climes?

All distribution is done by the band. We have just been approached by a distributor in Japan they have heard our last 2 albums in Japan and want to stock our CD's including our latest CD which is called Viva Las Topcats our CDs have gone to New Zealand, USA, Venice,Czech Republic, Germany and Spain.

What do you think has done the topcats most good career wise, you have some big things coming up I see from your gig guide your off to finland and you will also be playing hemsby this year, and I understand there is a big label interested in hearing your recordings .. can you tell us about anything like that or is it still hush hush?

I think just being true to our fans giving them what they want to hear. Yes we have been approached by a big label but it's still early days.

How long have you guys been friends?

20 plus years, more like a lifetime.

What do your better halves think about you disappearing for days on end?

They don't mind they know its all we have ever wanted so its great to have their support.

Does the band have an ultimate ambition, do you know where your heading or do you take every opportunity as it comes?

Nothing too big keep working our way across Europe and maybe fit in another CD at the end of the year.

Tights or Stockings?

Stockings, tights make you itch!

Is there anywhere that you wouldn't play?

No we give everyone a chance I don't think its right to restrict where you play as you never know what might come along.

You work hard with your arrangements and your vocals and harmonies is there a song that has beaten you?

Again NO! you tend to know what songs will work but we are always open to suggestions for any new material

Favourite Soup?

Minestrone with crusty bread.

Is this the original line up or have there been line up changes over the years? This is the original Topcats, Topcats wouldn't be the same without any one of us.

Steve I know that its mostly you that does the promotion and the bookings etc, how much time do you put into it and after a days work how hard is it to get motivated?

I'm constantly on the phone organising gigs, tours ,even when im at work so you could say yes its 24/7 non stop but I wouldn't have it any other way.

What do you think would have been your best gig from day one?

Robert Gordon

The Interview

Up to 1976 you were the singer in the band The Tuff Darts. What was the nucleus that changed Robert Gordon from punk singer to (as the press at the time were saying) leader of the rockabilly revival of the period?

I was never a punk singer. Even with the Tuff Darts, I did stuff like 'Twenty Flight Rock' and 'Heartbreak Hotel'. The Tuff Darts was a good band and we had some great times together, but it wasn't really what I wanted to do



How did the association with guitarist Link Wray happen?

Richard Gottehrer and I discussed various people that we admired, and Link's name popped up. The first time I saw Link was at a gig at Glen Echo Amusement Park in my hometown, and he was just amaz-

ing. I felt that it would be a great idea to do an album with him. So Richard contacted Link, who was living in San Francisco at the time. He came over to New York right away. That first album was recorded at Plaza Sound in April 1977. We selected most of the songs on the spot.

And at about the same time in the late 70's Bruce Springsteen was seen at your gigs both as a spectator and performer can you give us a little insight into that?

I met him through his bass player, Gary Tallent. We used to hang out a lot back then. Bruce gave me 'Fire' and even played piano on the session.

The first LP 'Fresh Fish Special' on the 'Private Stock' record label, did you have ideas for the tunes that would appear on it beforehand or was all this worked out at the recording session?

That's actually the second LP. Most songs were selected by me. They were mostly old favourites, songs that I've always loved.

RCA were the main distributors for 'Private Stock' how did you feel when you were signed directly to

RCA?

It was like a dream come true. RCA has always been associated with Presley, so it was very special for me to be on the same label

You parted company with Link Wray before you signed for RCA was your association with him on a record by record deal or musical differences?

I don't know the whole thing had run its course, I guess. Link was a great player, but it was always a bit hard on the road. We both wanted to do our own thing.

I had heard of Chris Spedding from a record he released in the UK in the mid seventies called 'Motor Bikin' but how did you guys get to meet?

Through my producer Richard Gottehrer, but I was aware of him, and I was already performing 'Wild Wild Women'.

Having the 'Jordanaires' as your backing vocal group must have given you a bit of a buzz. Can you tell us a little about their involvement on the first RCA LP 'Rockabilly Boogie'?

They did not sing on 'Rockabilly Boogie'. They sang on 'Fresh Fish Special'. It was very special for me to have them sing on the record. In fact, I've just recorded another album with them. It's a tribute to Elvis, and it's titled "It's Now Or Never".

The movie 'The Loveless' that you did with a young Willem Dafoe can you tell a little info on how this came about?

I can't remember that's a long time ago! Initially, they wanted me to record a couple of songs for the movie, and one thing led to the other.

Can you give us a little info on life with Robert Gordon today?

I'm very fortunate to be performing as often as I still am. I am on tour in April, and I'm very excited about that. We will be celebrating the 30th anniversary of my first hit 'Red Hot'. We're doing shows in Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Spain, France, Switzerland and the U.K. I have a great band with me, the Redhots from Finland. Those guys are the real deal.

Hemsby Rock 'n' Roll Weekender 19th - 21st April 2007

Review Part 1.

I have so much to tell you all and very little space so im gonna take a big breath and just go for it. Arrived checked in found our chalet fondly known as the chicken shed one of the original chalets on the site very endearing and definitely quaint the real deal 50's holiday experience.

Found the restaurant and some friend's, food was adequate and value for money nothing fancy but filling and hot. Camp very clean with friendly staff and lots of chat and smiles. Two ballrooms one medium sized and very authentic looking and one huge ballroom with all mod cons but no air conditioning. Stall areas scattered around the camp made for interesting shopping I thought it was nicer than the huge cramped market place we are used to.

Thursday Night started with Skinny Jim playing the tracks whilst the meet and greet was taking place and people shrugged off the journey, first band up was Phil Friendly USA and The Loners. This has got to be the worst spot in the world, but this four piece rockin' combo owned it, approximately 400 of the 650 that booked for the extra night were in and around the room and in traditional style surrounded the front of the stage so there was no escape. Punchy up tempo rockabilly with that authentic yank twang with a Dutch accent told us stories and belted Glen Glenn Mac Curtis, Ricky Nelson and the like. Well worth seeing .

Tony Thorpe took to the booth to fill the gap til the next band almost instantly the now warmed up crowd dashed to find a dance spot or a place at the bar and the place was buzzing.

Final band for this evening The Lonesome Valley Boys a five piece from the Isle Of Wight (soft spot emerging) the guys had a wee bit of sound trouble but nothing too bad and they flew through a set of mixed rockin' changing styles every few numbers, rock'n'roll, rockabilly, western swing, cajun, literally a bit of everything very tight and all at the right tempo percussion/stand up drums, double bass, steel guitar, accordion, harmonica, guitar, rhythm guitar, very original sound, my first of two valley boy performances this weekend. Excellent stuff and here comes Skinny Jim again and the floor is packed with boppers and jivers til 2am and then g'night campers see you in the morning.

Friday 2pm, Flintstone on the decks boppers on the floor J20 in my hand, friends to the left friends to the right YAY the next band up is The Barnshakers from Finland. This band is one I haven't seen for a while as I missed their latest visit but this visit they reminded me why they have such a huge UK following. These guys

are good, very good!

Buck Stevens and The Sugar Creek Trio. Well now then, one of the UK's finest bands fronted by Buck Stevens on this occasion had the crowd hanging on every note a very nice young man with a great voice. This 45 minutes went far too quick for my liking.

Marti Brom kicked off the events in the main ballroom in the evening backed by the Barnshakers. This was an incredible set this young lady has some voice I can tell ya and oddly its much better live than on her cd's which makes a nice change she wooed her crowd male and female and spent ages in the foyer chatting and signing. What a star!

Ray Campi on his birthday, what more can you ask? Ray was up for it the second he joined the Hemsby House band on stage. Caterpillar kicked off the set and it ended with Tore up and there was a whole career in between fantastic belt off a skip and a jump and rapturous applause screaming cheering and whooping.

Bloodshot Bill, last months featured interview joined by

the Hemsby House Band. Again, Bloodshot whipped up the crowd and himself until he leaped over the barrier and danced and sung in with the crowd. His set was a very interesting experience and as wild as it gets, this guy has all the moves the looks etc very entertaining.

Last of the night The Caravans. I had waited all night for this and from the introduction I shed twenty years after the first couple of numbers. A huge crowd of hard core fan started wrecking in front of the stage and there it was 80's






